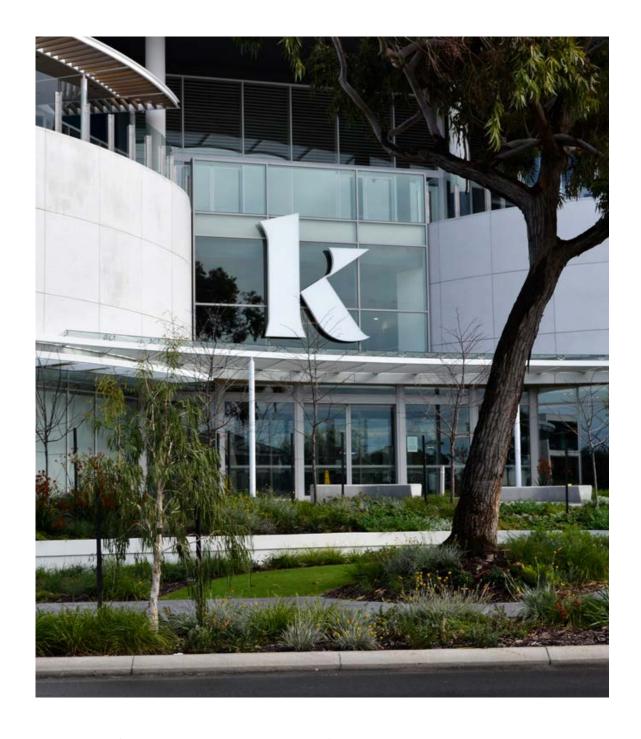

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Introduction

Back in 2019, Kingman was awarded the signage contract for the highly anticipated rebrand and redevelopment of Karrinyup shopping centre.

Although the project was a big one, Kingman was more than confident in our capability of delivering the predicted scope of work on time and on budget for our valued client and the chosen builder for the project, Multiplex.

- Aluminium fabricated letters, internally illuminated with LED's and Opal acrylic applied to the face
- Internal and external Statutory signage
- Directional wayfinding signage package

Behind the scenes

Kingman has a long history of delivering iconic signage projects for Multiplex, and this project was no different.

Kingman's project management team ensured a seamless delivery, through all the logistics of fabricating and installing every sign.

The signage package included internal and external statutory signs, directional wayfinding signs and signage for a multilevel carpark. Included was beautiful handpainted graphics along with all external signs and, of course, the brand new shiny 15.5 metre tall Pylon that was designed to match Karrinyup's modern branding.





Working closely with Multiplex for AMP Capital, Kingman were on-site during this redevelopment for almost two years. The Kingman factory saw a steady stream of Karrinyup signs constantly flowing through our factory.

Statutory signs

Kingman manufactured and installed every piece of statutory signage throughout the entire precinct. This included fire doors, emergency exits, service room doors and bathroom signs with the addition of Braille and Tactile signage in the appropriate locations.

All front of house signs have been custom manufactured with high end materials and 2 pac painted finish.









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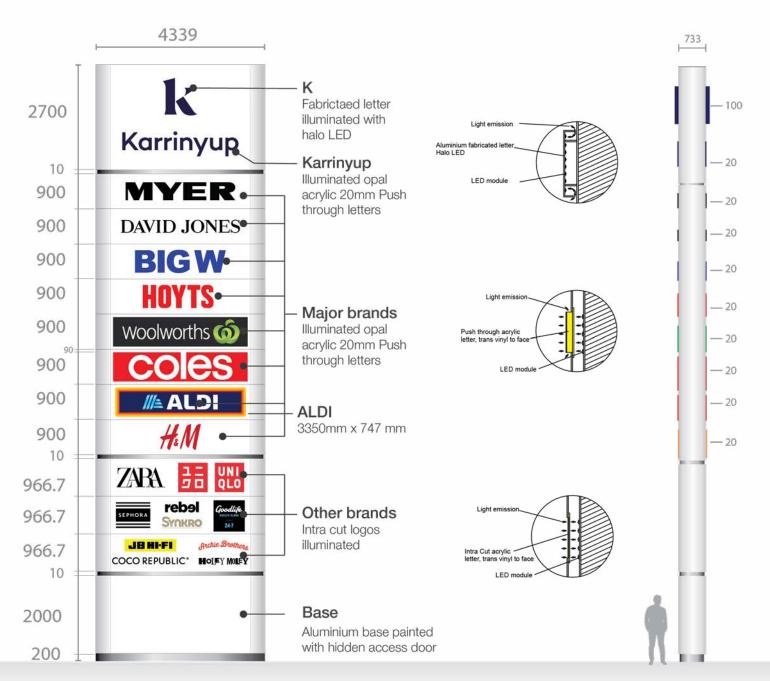


Pylon

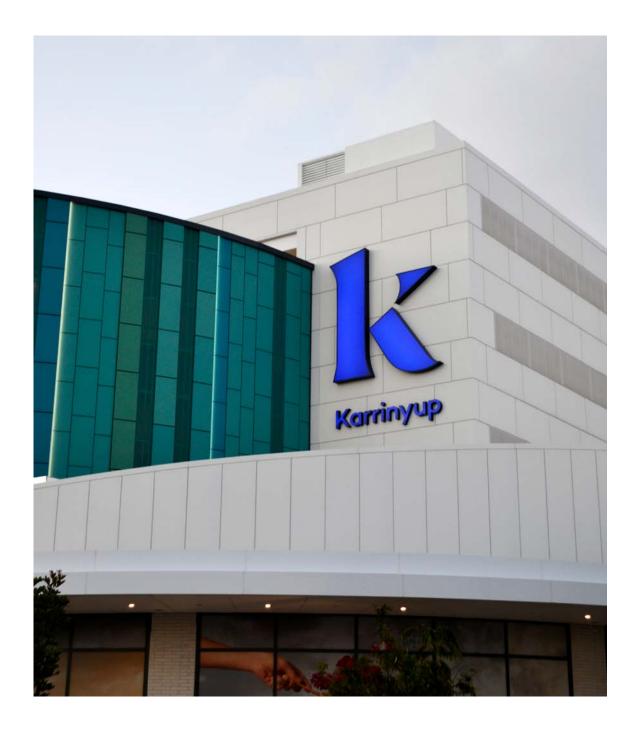
The main iconic Karrinyup pylon was originally built by Kingman back in 2011.

The new pylon is a cleaner, contemporary design but still imposing at 15.5 metres tall and almost 5 metres wide.

The fabrication of this pylon incorporates a steel skeletal structure, 13,800 mm tall, plus multiple design aspects on both sides including the LED halo illuminated K, illuminated opal acrylic push through letters, intra cut illuminated logos and an aluminium base.







External branding

The external branding Kingman created for this development includes a number of Karrinyup branded signs around the exterior of the complex, as well as signage for Hoyts, Woolworths, David Jones, Uniqlo, H&M, Zara, The Good Company & more.

These external signs were fabricated in a number of different ways, and installed using a variety of methods including the use of a boom lift, with the letters predrilled and pinned to the wall to achieve a beautiful backlit illumination effect.









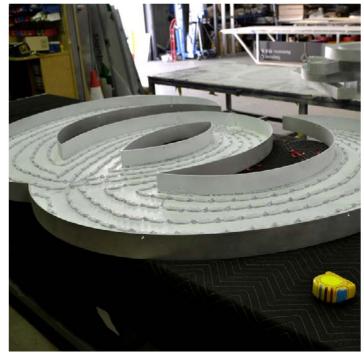








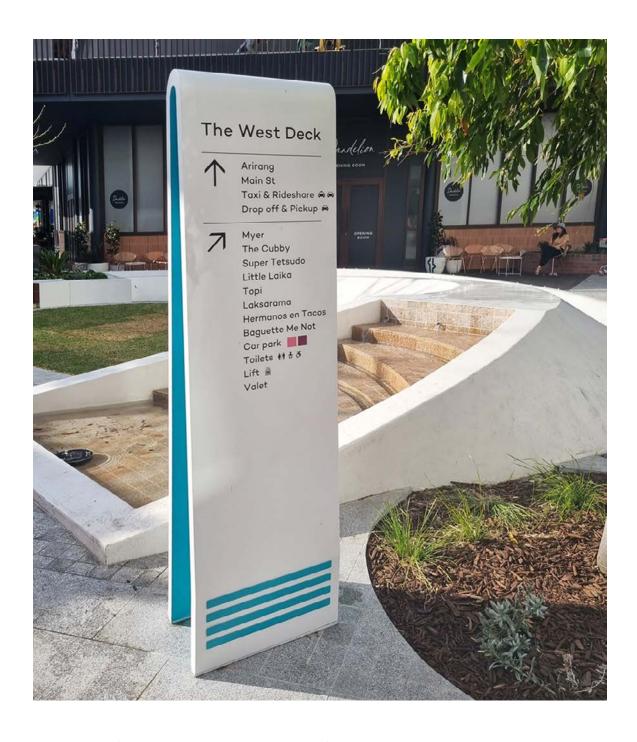








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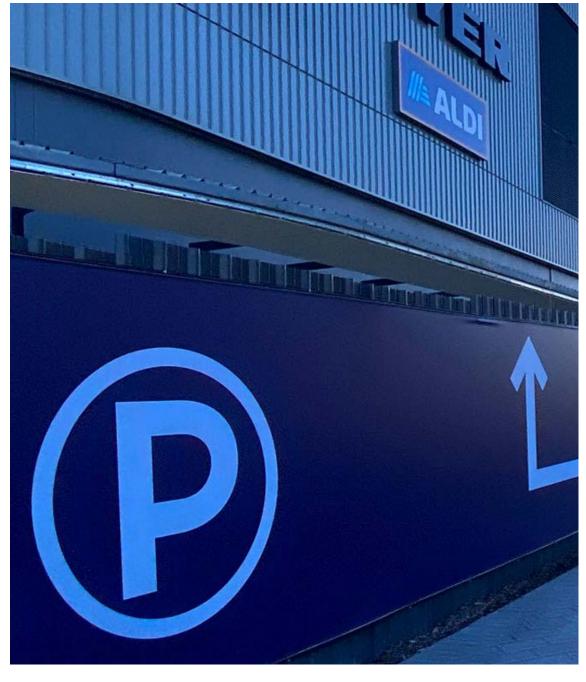


Wayfinding

The wayfinding package was designed by Urbanite at Frost Collective, and Kingman created and delivered on their vision.

The car park's centerpiece is undoubtedly the beautiful hand painted graphic across the wall, tying in delicately with the rest of their wayfinding pieces.

Included in the directional wayfinding were signs for Karrinyup's multi level carpark, internal pylons within the shopping centre, exterior car park navigational signs.





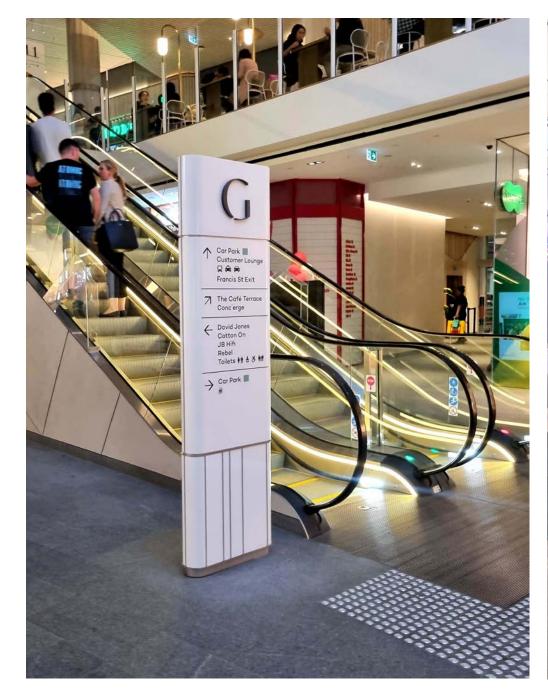
